Submission to Council Meeting

Introduction

In May 2016, Southbank Residents Association was given the privilege by this Council to break the news to the Southbank community that the contract with Boyd Park Developer (Mackie Group) for the 'Regent Square' residential development on the Boyd site on City Road in Southbank had been revoked.

We broke this news - via a member newsletter and social media posts - on 11 May 2016, and received an overwhelming number of messages of support from residents, all advocating for a park at the site. Given our purpose is to advocate for Southbank residents, we harnessed this community enthusiasm and started a petition on Change.org to give people an avenue to express their opinions.

Petition

At the time of writing this submission, our petition (entitled *City of Melbourne: We need a park at Boyd before it's too late!*) has reached 732 signatures, and is still steadily climbing.

We've included a digital copy of all signatures and comments as an appendix to this submission, for those wishing to read what residents have to say.

Community Support

On learning the contract with the Mackie group was to be terminated we've seen a groundswell of support for more green space on the site in the form of a park. The Southbank community has always been vocal with regard to the development of this site and understand this is a unique opportunity to establish a considerable sized park for residents and visitors, in favour of the alternative, going out to tender for another development in its stead.

We firmly believe our petition demonstrates to Council the commitment of residents to green open space and the inherent opportunities this could offer our community.

Media & Social Media

Our cause was featured on the front page of the June edition of *Southbank Local News* and was mentioned in an online article on *Urban Melbourne* on 27 June 2016. Our Facebook page has experienced an all-time peak in activity with a 650% increase in reach to 5,730 Facebook users and a 481% engagement between 384 people. These figures indicate the level of interest and concern with regard to this matter.



Recommendations

While we readily acknowledge this Council has many competing interests for this site, we'd like to submit the following recommendations:

- Council to allocate the entire area within the original planning permit to green open space in the form of a community park.
- Council to postpone any decisions to put the site back out for tender until further investigations can be conducted.
- Council to engage in community consultation to determine the needs of the community at large.

Urban Planning

As Council well knows, Southbank is the most densely populated suburb in Melbourne with only 2.5 square metres of public open space per person. Compare this with the Melbourne Open Space Strategy's recommendation of 20 square metres of public open space per person and it is clear an improvement is needed.

Conclusion

In summary, we ask Council to carefully consider the options before them today, in light of the clear message sent by the community.

Southbank residents and visitors need a place for children to play, owners to walk their dogs, workers to take a break and friends to congregate and the Boyd Community Hub site is the ideal location. Furthermore, this particular site is located in the highest density block within the suburb of Southbank and hence the entire metropolitan area.

We want to seize this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity and give something back to Southbank residents before we end up with another residential tower and lose the opportunity for good.

Surely there comes a time when planning is more important than profit. This investment will no doubt provide an immeasurable return on investment that is certain to outstrip any short-term gains made from the sale of this scarce land.
